The young explorer collected some beautiful things from the nature in their own paper bags made of newspaper.



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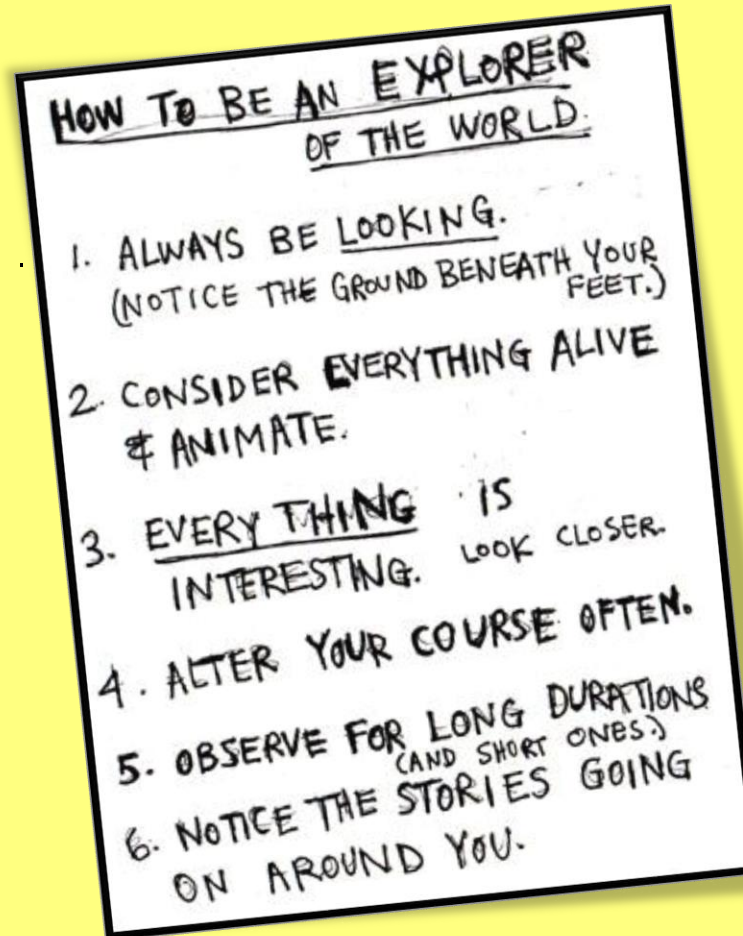
Illustrative Recall
