Shivika said, "(pointing towards Bada Gumbad) aaisa Deer park ke paas bhi hai"

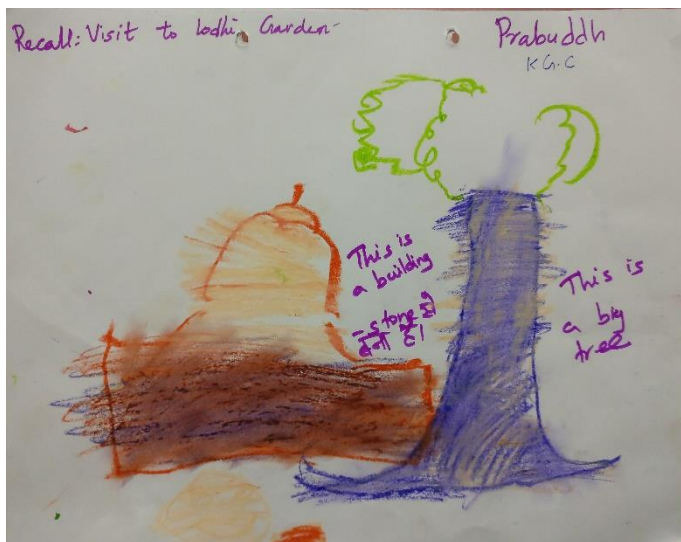
